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Do I need a vaccine if I already had Covid?
Yes. Recovering from covid does not protect you from getting reinfected by other variants or from spreading the virus to others. The vaccines will help protect you and those around you.

FAQ's Continued...

Who should and shouldn't get vaccinated?
People who have underlying conditions, are pregnant or nursing are encouraged to get vaccinated. Only the Pfizer has been approved for people 16+, the other two are for 18+ and children younger than 16 are not able to get any of these vaccines.

Once I'm fully vaccinated, Covid guidelines don't pertain to me right?
Fully vaccinated people are permitted to not social distance or wear masks with only other fully vaccinated people. Everyone should still wear masks and social distance while in public because even vaccinated people can spread the virus to unvaccinated people.

Worried about not being able to access the vaccine?

The CT.gov website says that, "No person will be turned away based on their ability to show ID. While sharing your contact information may not be required to get a vaccine, staff at the vaccination site may ask individuals for an ID, but this only applies to people who have one....Individuals can still get the COVID-19 vaccine without insurance or an ID,"

Additionally, there should be no payment or charges to individuals for getting a vaccine.

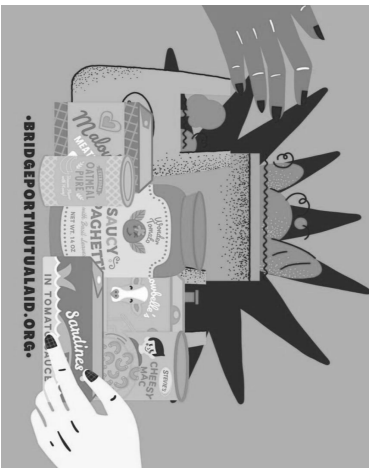


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
